# INTRODUCTION:

A GENERAL OVERVIEW OF THE EVANGELISM STUDIES Evangelism is one of those things that we know we should do in our lives as Christians but is so much easier said than done!

This four-week series of studies takes us through different ways that we can be evangelistic in the way that we live and how we speak to others. It uses material from Sam Chan as well as exploring what the Bible has to say about evangelism.

# WEEK 1: INTRODUCTION PERSONAL BIBLE READING GUIDE

#### MONDAY

Read 1 Corinthians 9:1-12

- 1. What do you think Paul means by calling himself 'free' in this passage (see 1 Corinthians 8)?
- 2. What rights does Paul claim Christian workers have? What reason does he give for not claiming them?
- 3. What 'rights' do you feel like you have in this life?
- 4. Would you be willing to give them up for the sake of the gospel? What might that look like in your life?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

#### TUESDAY

Read 1 Corinthians 9:13-23

- 1. What does Paul do for the sake of the spread of the gospel?
- 2. What are some ways that this can translate into our lives today?
- 3. What is the motivation behind all that Paul does? Do you have this similar motivation in your life? Why or why not?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

#### WEDNESDAY

Read 1 Corinthians 9:24-27

- 1. What do you think is the prize that Paul is talking about here?
- 2. How is one to reach this prize?
- 3. In what areas of life may you need to practice more self-discipline for the sake of the gospel?

Read Acts 17:1-15

- 1. What was Paul doing as he travelled around?
- 2. What are the two different reactions to the preaching of Christ in this passage?
- 3. What can we learn from the behaviour of the Bereans?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

#### FRIDAY

Read Acts 17:16-34

- 1. What does the passage say was the reason behind Paul's preaching in Athens?
- 2. How does Paul explain the truths of the gospel to the 'Men of Athens'?
- 3. What can we learn from the way that Paul contextualised the gospel to the people in Athens? How can we do that today as we seek to share the gospel to those we know?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

#### SATURDAY AND SUNDAY

If you missed any studies throughout the week, you can do them on these days.

# WEEK 1 GC STUDY: LISTENING WELL

Share a time when it was obvious someone was listening to you and contrast that with a time you felt like you were not heard. What were the key things that were different in those circumstances?

Read Titus 3:1-11

- 1. What are the things that Titus is to teach/stress to the early church?
- 2. What reason/motivation does Paul give for this?
- 3. What difference would a life lived like this make to those who witness it?

### TUESDAY

Read 1 Peter 1:22-2:3

- 1. How does Peter call God's people to act?
- 2. What reason does he give for this?
- 3. How are you going at loving others?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

### WEDNESDAY

Read 1 Peter 2:4-12

- 1. How does Peter describe God's people?
- 2. Considering this, what type of life does Peter call the people to?
- 3. What witness does this type of life have to those around us?
- 4. How are you going at living a life like this?

Read Luke 16:1-17

- 1. Describe what is happening in this parable in your own words.
- 2. For what did the steward's master commend him?
- 3. List all the questions you have about this parable below (hopefully tomorrow you can answer them!  $\bigcirc$  )

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

### FRIDAY

Read Luke 16:1-17

- 1. Who do you think are the 'people of this world'? Who are the 'people of the light' (verse 8)?
- 2. How does Jesus explain money and wealth here? Considering this, how does that help explain what he says in verse 9?
- 3. What resources do you have that can help the growth of the kingdom? How might you use them in your life for this purpose?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

Read 1 Peter 3:13-17

- 1. What are the Christians to be prepared to do?
- 2. How are they to do this?
- 3. Do you feel ready to give this answer? What can you do to help prepare yourself to do this?

Read 1 Peter 3:13-22

- 1. How does Peter describe suffering in this passage?
- 2. Is that how you commonly view suffering?
- 3. What encouragement does Peter give to those who do suffer?
- 4. What relationship does suffering have with sharing the gospel?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

### FRIDAY

Read Acts 3:1-26

- 1. How does Peter use what happened to the crippled man to preach the gospel?
- 2. Who is Peter speaking to? How do you think this influenced what Peter said to them?
- 3. What can we learn from how Peter preached the gospel? In what ways can we draw on people's lives/their beliefs to share Jesus with them?

# WEEK 3 GC STUDY: TELL A BETTER STORY

- 3. What is Jesus teaching through this parable?
- 4. What opportunities do you have to show mercy to people in your life? How are you going at doing this?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

#### WEDNESDAY

Read John 13:31-35

- 1. What does Jesus teach his followers to do?
- 2. What will this show to the world?
- 3. How are you going at loving people? How can you be more loving to those around you?

Read Matthew 5:13-16

- 1. How does Jesus use salt and light to describe his followers?
- 2. What reason does Jesus give for doing good deeds?
- 3. How can you be salt and light to those around you this week?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

#### FRIDAY

Read Colossians 4:2-6

- 1. How does Paul exhort the people to act?
- 2. What do you think it means to 'let your conversation be always full or grace, seasoned with salt...'?
- 3. What do your conversations with people look like? Are they like what Paul describes here? Why or why not?
- 4. What are some things that you can do to grow in this area?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

# WEEK 4 GC STUDY: LIFESTYLE EVANGELISM

# WHOLE FAMILY LEARNING IDEAS

How we can help kids with evangelism:<sup>1</sup>

- 1. Teach them that God is mission-minded: This can be as simple as teaching that God loves everyone, and he wants all people to know that.
  - a. Run a WFL session on God's love. You could use the Bible Project video about this: <u>https://bibleproject.com/blog/how-do-we-describe-gods-love/</u>. Spend some time afterwards chatting about what they thought/learnt and then pray for one another.

### 2. Teach them the gospel.

- a. Run a WFL session on what Jesus has done for us. You could read 'The Garden, the Curtain and the Cross' by Carl Laferton & Catalina Echeverri (Illus) or watch it here: <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IHwr70bJIZ8</u> Spend some time afterwards chatting about what they thought/learnt and then pray for one another.
- 3. Encourage kids to **pray** for their friends.

Ask all members of your GC to choose 2 people to pray for and pray for one another. You could do a share and pray for the person on your left session, or just ask people to pray for their friends themselves; gauge what is best for the age of people that you have. Be great if you could follow this up next WFL session as well to see how God has answered the prayers

4. Teach them **how to explain the gospel** to their friends. For the primary aged children go teach them the 'one minute gospel explanation' that you can find here <u>https://growingfaith.com.au/articles/the-one-minute-gospel-explanation</u>.

Teach it to them, encourage them to remember it, and to tell one friend about it this week.
