

## INTRODUCTION: GALATIANS

A GENERAL OVERVIEW OF GALATIANS

The Author: Galatians was written by the apostle Paul

When was it written and who for: Galatians is a letter that was written around Ad 50 for the Christian churches in the area of Galatia in Asia Minor. These were both Jewish and Gentile Christians.

**Themes and Purpose:** The letter of Galatians is all about the gospel of Jesus; what the gospel is and how the gospel works itself out in the everyday life of Christians. The churches in Galatia were being influenced by false teaching, so Paul reminds them of the truths of the Gospel. Thus, the purpose of this letter is to show the reader the truths of the gospel and how they change everything about our lives and how we live.

The main themes of the letter are:

- Justification is by faith alone, not by works. This truth affects how we relate to all people, including other Christians.
- Christians are sanctified by their faith in Christ, through the work of the Holy Spirit.

Read Acts 15:1-35

- 3. What do you learn about Paul in this passage?
- 4. What does this teach you about the way that God works in this world?

Read Philippians 3:1-10

- 1. What light does this passage shed on the life of Paul and his conversion?
- 2. In what ways are you tempted to put confidence in 'the flesh' in your life?
- 3. Where is it that we should be looking for our confidence?

#### WEDNESDAY

Read Acts 15:1-21 and Galatians 2:1-10

- 1. What false teaching was threatening the church?
- 2. How does Peter refute this false teaching?

How might we be tempted to add to and/or change the gospel today? How can this affect the unity of Christians?

Have there been times in your life when you have begun to think that your performance counts toward your salvation? What caused you to think this way?

How can we ourselves 'bring us into slavery'? And how can we bring others into slavery?

What are some things that you can do in your life to guard against this?

- 2. In what ways can you be tempted to get right with God through rules, law-keeping or good works?
- 3. How can you 'preach Christ' to yourself daily so as to guard against this temptation?

Read 2 Corinthians 5:11-21 and Galatians 2:11-21

- 1. What does Paul say Christ has done for all people?
- 2. How does one change when they accept Christ?
- 3. What light does this shed on Paul's teaching in Galatians chapter 2?
- 4. In what ways are you still living your old life? How can you live more for Christ this week?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

#### FRIDAY

Read Romans 3:9-30 and Galatians 2:11-21

- 1. Who is under sin and what hope is there for those who try to work for righteousness?

#### TUESDAY

Read John 3:1-15 and Galatians 3:1-5

- 1. What does Jesus mean when he says one is to be 'born again'?
- 2. What role does the Holy Spirit play in this?
- 3. How then does one receive this new life that Paul is also talking about?
- 4. What does this teach you about the relationship between the gospel and the Holy Spirit?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

#### WEDNESDAY

Read Galatians 3:6-9

- 1. What sort of man was Abraham and what did this mean for him?
- 2. What does it mean to 'have faith' like Abraham?
- 3. Considering this, how is one made right with God? How do you see this truth live out in your life?

Read Genesis 15:1-6 and Galatians 3:1-9

- 1. What promises does God make to Abraham?
- 2. How does Abraham respond to this?
- 3. What do you think it means for Abraham's faith to be counted as righteousness?
- 4. How does this further help you to understand Galatians 3:1-9?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

#### FRIDAY

Read Galatians 3:10-14

- 1. What is the result of trying to be saved by the law or our works?
- 2. What does it mean that Jesus became 'a curse for us' (verse 13)?
- 3. What blessing do Christians receive because of what Jesus did?
- 4. In what ways are you tempted to believe that you are saved by your works and how does this affect your life?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

#### SATURDAY AND SUNDAY

If you missed any studies throughout the week, you can do them on these days.

## WEEK 5 GC STUDY: GALATIANS 3:1–14

Think of the growth that you have had in your Christian life. When has this been at 'it's worst' and when has it been at 'it's best'?

What are the churches in Galatia trying to add to the gospel message they heard? What does Paul think of them because of this?

What do you think 'the goal' is that Paul mentions in verse 3? What is wrong with how they are trying to reach this goal? Where should they have been looking <del>to</del> instead?

When does one receive the Holy Spirit and what role does the Spirit have in a Christian's life? Considering this, how is the work of the Holy Spirit linked with the gospel?

What does the example of Abraham add to Paul's argument in this passage?

How does the work of Christ change all of this for people?

Are you in danger of forgetting that the gospel is the source of your ongoing acceptance? How, and why?

How are you tempted to rely on your human effort to grow as a Christian?

How does going back to the gospel when we sin change the outcomes and our ongoing Christian walk?

What difference does having righteousness credited to us make on the way we see:

- Ourselves?
- Our Christian lives?
- Jesus?

- 2. What were the Galatians at risk of believing?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

#### TUESDAY

Read Galatians 3:19-22

- 1. What does Paul say is the purpose of the law?
- 2. Is this how you have thought of the law before? Why or why not?
- 3. How does seeing God's law like this affect how you view Christ's work on the cross?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

#### WEDNESDAY

Read Galatians 3:23-25

- 1. How is the law both a guard and a guiding force for people?
- 2. What has happened now that faith in Jesus has come?
- 3. In what ways are you still living 'under the supervision of the law'? How does this affect your life?

Read Romans 7:1-25 and Galatians 3:23-25

- 1. What does Paul teach here about what it means when you become a Christian?
- 2. How does this teaching add to what Paul is teaching in Galatians 3?
- 3. What sin are you currently struggling with? Spend some time repenting to God and asking for the Holy Spirit's help in this area.

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

#### FRIDAY

Read Matthew 5:17-20 and Galatians 3:15-25

- 1. What has Jesus done with the law? How is this possible? And what does it mean?
- 2. Where does the type of righteousness that Jesus describes in verse 20 come from?
- 3. How is Jesus' teaching about the law the same or different to that of Paul's in Galatians?

Pray (Praise, Confession, Thanksgiving, Ask)

- 3. How are you going with putting on your 'new self'? What is one thing that you can work on this week?

What idols exist in your life? How do these idols enslave you?

How does remembering that God knows you, free you from the temptation to worship those idols?

How does this passage further your understanding of what it means to be in gospel ministry?

We can all be gospel ministers to fellow Christians. How might your ministry need to change based on what you have learnt in this study?

- What is the difference between the acts of the flesh and the acts of the Spirit?
- What does the Holy Spirit do in us?
- Have you noticed any good fruit lately in your life?

Then **pray** together about what you have talked about.
