Hopefully some of your questions were answered and you feel more equipped to talk to your friends and family about those topics. Maybe you now have more questions! The sermons have raised some issues that you hadn't thought through before or they just didn't quite deal with the questions that you have. If so, we hope that this resource will help you work through those together as a GC.

As a reminder here were the different topics that we covered:



QUESTIONS FOR GOD

- 5/5 – “WHO DECIDES WHO I AM?” (MIKEY)
- 12/5 – “DO CHRISTIANS BELIEVE IN BEAUTY?” (AARON)
- 19/5 – “DOESN’T HISTORY DISPROVE THE BIBLE?” (BEN)
- 26/5 – “WAS JESUS A FEMINIST?” (BERNIE)
- 2/6* – “IS IT OK TO HAVE QUESTIONS FOR GOD?” (BERNIE, *ALL-AGES)
- 9/6 – “WHY CAN’T WE JUST BE REAL?” (MIKEY)

Was there one of the topics that you found particularly helpful or that you got to share with a friend?

Do you have any questions that were not answered about one of the topics or something that came out of the sermon that you are unsure of? Or that a friend may have asked you?

If you have some questions, use the below framework to help you work through them together.

1. Write down the question and discuss what the culture around us has to say about it.
2. What does the gospel and/or Bible passages say about this topic?
3. Can we trace the issue across the Bible's unfolding message?

4. How does this help us to understand this issue?

5. How could you answer this question if someone asked you?
